In addition to heading her own practice, IndigoJLD Green + Health, Joyce is also on adjunct faculty at the University of Pennsylvania teaching courses in sustainability, health and the built environment. Prior to Philadelphia, Joyce oversaw the survey of major city-owned structures (over 200 million sq. ft.) and identified opportunities in green design and development at NYC OMB. Her experience in working with public and cultural institutions makes her a valued advisor in public-private partnerships.

Joyce received the Public Architect Award from American Institute of Architects New York Chapter (AIA NY). She is also the co-author of the award-winning Active Design Guidelines and the Precedent Library for Stormwater Management. The contents have been translated to graduate curriculum and lectures. Joyce was a trustee of the Grand Rapids Art Museum and an advisor to the Harvard Chan School of Public Health executive education. She is a board director of the French American Chamber of Commerce in Philadelphia and the incoming chair of the American Alliance of Museums Professional Network. She had been a grantee of the Rockefeller Brothers Fund with a project in South China. Joyce is the recipient of numerous awards from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, Health and Human Services, the Sustainable Industry Building Council, the American Council of Engineering Companies and the Aga Khan Award from Harvard/MIT.
